Response: Our symptomatic clinics are risk rated according to patients age, but not the family history clinics if the patient does not have cancer. Pts may be risk rated if they are sent for genetic testing and depending on their results.

Q5. For people referred into your family history service, does your unit have any additional inclusion criteria it uses to determine who can receive different types of support, in addition to the eligibility criteria outlined in NICE CG164 guidance, and if so, what are those criteria for:

Undertaking an initial family history risk assessment	
Access to risk-reduction interventions, both chemoprevention and mastectomy	
Access to enhanced surveillance screening	

Response: If a patient is of a high risk according to their genetic testing, they may be offered risk reducing mastectomy.
