RESPONSE

Please note that this response pertains only to St Helens and Knowsley Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust, which is no longer a legal entity. Indeed, St Helens and Knowsley Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust and Southport and Ormskirk Hospital NHS Trust became a single legal entity known as Mersey and West Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust on 1st July 2023.

1. The <u>NICE Guideline (73)</u> states that every general gynaecological department should have a gynaecologist with special interest in endometriosis, by which they should then have additional training by means of <u>OSATS requirements</u> for subspeciality or other advanced qualifications.

2. The number of Clinical Nurse Specialists specialising in endometriosis appointed within your NHS Trust and working within gynaecological departments?

3. The number of people currently waiting to see a (a) gynaecologist and (b) gynaecologist with additional training in endometriosis?

We do not have a specific endometriosis clinic so not possible to say how many women waiting to be seen specifically for endometriosis as they would attend a GOPD and be seen / managed by other consultants.

4. The current wait time, in weeks, detailing how long the current wait time is to see a (a) gynaecologist and (b) gynaecologist with special interest in endometriosis?

Wait to be seen in outpatients is approximately 20 weeks providing no cancellations. We do not have a designated specialist in Endometriosis.

5. The number of people currently waiting for a gynaecological laparoscopy? The current wait time, in weeks, for a gynaecological laparoscopy?

We have minimal patients waiting for just a laparoscopy and when they are dated would be dependent upon the urgency they are listed for. We do not have designated endometriosis lists.

6. The current wait time, in weeks, for patients requiring access to secondary care for (a) endometriosis and (b) gynaecological issues?

All referred to general Gynaecology - general wait as above.

7. The current number of patients being referred or treated for fertility issues directly because of either confirmed endometriosis, suspected endometriosis or an additional suspected gynaecological issue?

We have 13 sessions per week in theatre with 2 designated lists for Ca.

b. endometriosis?

We do not have specific endometriosis theatre lists.

We have 13 theatre sessions per week and none that are dedicated to endometriosis.
