Both – consultant and nurse led outpatient clinics, currently developing a one stop service. Inpatients initially seen by Vascular Specialist Nurses with input from consultants if needed.

Southport and Ormskirk:

Both – outpatient vascular nurse & doctor in clinic. Inpatients are seen predominantly by TVN which is nurse led with input from medical team as required.

Inpatient and OPD – Non healing wound present for more than 2 weeks on lower limb, limb swelling, recurrent cellulitis, or out of range ABPI. TBPI – performed and compression commenced if appropriate.

Southport and Ormskirk:

For OPD vascular - GP referral via choose and book. For TVN inpatient - all lower leg wounds referred electronically and assessed by TVN. ABPI and compression commenced if appropriate treatment.
