Subject: Vaccination Policy

## **REQUEST**

1. I have heard that a patient has entered a hospital with an entrapment injury and been administered a three-part medical device (vaccine) including the covid vaccine; the usual intervention being a tetanus injection. Can you confirm that the NHS is operating this practice by policy or protocol, that a patient should receive this vaccine without appropriate informed consent?

## **RESPONSE**

St Helens and Knowsley Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust and Southport and Ormskirk Hospital NHS Trust became a single legal entity known as Mersey and West Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust on 1<sup>st</sup> July 2023, as such parts of the response may be provided in two sections relating to the hospital sites of each of the legacy organisations.

1. I have heard that a patient has entered a hospital with an entrapment injury and been administered a three-part medical device (vaccine) including the covid vaccine; the usual intervention being a tetanus injection. Can you confirm that the NHS is operating this practice by policy or protocol, that a patient should receive this vaccine without appropriate informed consent?

The Trust categorically do not administer Covid vaccines to patients without their consent. We use a tetanus vaccine called Revaxis when we need to provide a tetanus booster. Verbal consent would be sought prior to administration of this vaccine.
